School playground

Perfect for nursery schools, these groves form ideal individual hidey-holes for small children to play in. Each of the three new seating areas has its own individual character. The natural wooden objects are perfect for kids to climb on, and their figurative elements play to a child's imagination. One particularly special feature is the use of indigenous tree and shrub species, arranged using different varieties to teach children about new natural shapes and colors. The expansion of the play area for the primary school playground creates space for group learning and communication-based group games. Imaginative natural wooden objects create an awareness of animals and encourage role-play.





'At the River of Stones' garden

An aesthetic collage of vegetation and stone strips, this front garden is a memorable place. A foot-bridge leads visitors from the front garden into the building. Several organically formed spaces divide the garden into different areas. The spacious wooden patio affords a good view of the house. Metal raised beds are embedded in grey stone gravel chippings. A path made of stone slabs leads through different areas of the garden. The lower part of the garden is designed with natural elements. A willow structure entwines the oval wooden deck and marks a smooth transition towards the natural landscape. The 'river of stones' lies at the lowest point of the garden and is from time to time filled with water. The stone blocks on its 'banks' are partly covered with wooden decks creating comfortable benches.
